Eligibility: Full-time students of Armenian heritage pursuing: Master's degree in communications, education administration, public administration or international relations; Ph.D. in Armenian studies (final two years only); first professional degree in law (J.D.) or medicine (M.D.). Candidates must be students enrolled in highly competitive colleges and universities. Applicants must also have a GPA of 3.5 or better during their undergraduate study.

Terms of Award: Loans range from \$5,000 - \$7,500 yearly. Repayments begin within 12 months of completion of full-time study and extended 5 to 10 years depending on the amount of the loan. The interest rate of 3% begins when repayment of loan is initiated.
